ORDINANCE NO. 2015 - 3

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF YORK TO PROVIDE FOR AN ADDITIONAL CHAPTER FOR THE REGULATION OF ACTIVITIES ON TOWNSHIP PROPERTY

The York Township Board of Commissioners, York County, Pennsylvania, enacts and ordains as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 227 of the Code of the Township of York is hereby created and shall read as follows:

Chapter 227 Activities on Township Property

§ 227-1 Mulch.

York Township residents shall have access to the York Township campus, during designated dates and times, and shall be permitted to take Township produced mulch therefrom at no cost. Mulch shall not be available to non-residents or any person using such mulch in a commercial business or for resale. The mulch shall be spread on residential properties located within the Township. The use of mechanical devices to load mulch shall be strictly prohibited. The Township shall be authorized to limit the amount of mulch that can be taken by any person. All persons shall strictly obey any instructions and rules conveyed and/or posted by the Township.

§ 227-2. Brush Drop Off.

York Township residents shall have access to the York Township campus, during designated dates and times, for the purpose of dropping off brush at specified locations. Brush shall be limited to tree limbs (no larger than 8 feet long and 8 inches in diameter), tree trimmings, dead garden materials and small leaf quantities. Grass clippings, stones, dirt, treated lumber, stumps and construction materials are strictly prohibited. Brush may be dropped off in biodegradable Kraft bags but all other bags or containers are strictly prohibited. All persons shall strictly obey any instructions and rules conveyed and/or posted by the Township.

§ 227-3. Violations and Penalties.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Chapter shall be guilty of a summary offense and, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 and, in default in payment, to imprisonment for a term not to exceed 30 days. Each violation of this Chapter shall constitute a separate offense.
