SIGN UP TODAY WITH XPRESS BILL PAY!

York Township has partnered with Xpress Bill Pay for electronic payments of sewer bills.

Each billing cycle, you will receive a reminder email to let you know when your bill is online. Then, just log into your account at xpressbillpay.com or use the mobile app to view your bill.

When you're ready to pay your bill, select a payment type. You can pay with a credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer. You also have the ability to set up your bill on Auto Pay.

FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S DESK

The **2024/2025 School Tax Bill** will be mailed out on 7/15/24. The discount rate is due by **9/15/24**. Please add your phone number/email address on the check, in case we need to reach you regarding your payment. If you haven't received your School Tax Bill, or you have moved, please email k.crumling@yorktownship.com or call **717-741-0056**, so we can get the bill to you.

If you have received a **Supplemental / Interim Tax Bill**, and have a current escrowed mortgage, please contact your mortgage company to see how they want to handle payment of the bill. The supplemental / interim bill is in addition to your County/Township and School Bills.

Newly built properties in the township are assessed after purchase by the York County Assessment Office, this will generate a new tax bill. This bill is in addition to the County/Township (2/15) and School (7/15) Bills. If you have an escrowed mortgage, please contact them, to see how they plan to pay the bill. You should receive paperwork from the York County Assessment Office regarding the new assessment.

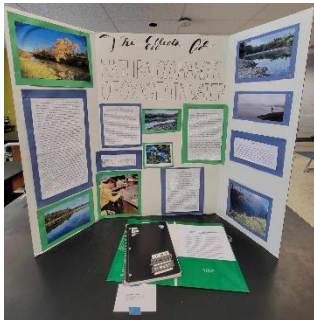
There will be a possible vacation week in June. Details regarding our hours will be on our voicemail closer to the time.

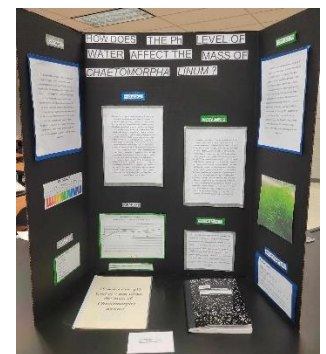
2024 DALLASTOWN AREA HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE & ENGINEERING FAIR WINNERS

York Township congratulates the 2024 York Township Science & Engineering Fair scholarship winners. York Township provides scholarships for the best junior and senior "Water Quality or Stormwater Management Project" as part of our stormwater management program.



The senior project winner selected was "The Effects of Natural Occurrences of Oxygen in Water," by **Asher Gist**, 10th grade. The purpose of Asher's project was to "determine how the location of a specific area of water affected the level of oxygen present in the water."

The junior project winner selected was "How Does the pH Level of Water Affect the Mass of *Chaetomorpha linum*?" by **Landon Schwartzer**, 7th grade. The purpose of Landon's project was to "determine how the differing pH levels of water affect the mass of *Chaetomorpha linum*, which is an abundant, fertile type of green algae that plays an important role in the environment."

YORK TOWNSHIP UPDATES COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

York Township has recently begun the process of updating the Township's Comprehensive Plan as a Joint Plan with Spring Garden Township and with the help of Environmental Planning and Design. This Joint Comprehensive Plan is a multi-year plan to address a wide range of issues that have an impact on the future of York and Spring Garden Townships, such as transportation, housing, public services, population trends, historic resources, economic conditions and much more.

To be successful, the Joint Comprehensive Plan will need the input of the Township citizens. There will also be surveys and public meetings with the Township Planning Commission and the Board of Commissioners where everyone is welcome to provide input.

OBSTRUCTIONS THAT OVERHANG THE ROAD

Please be aware that as property owners in York Township, you are responsible to keep your property clear from any obstructions that overhang the edge of the road. Examples include but are not limited to tree limbs, shrubbery, hedges, grassy areas, mailboxes, fencing, etc. Many activities occur close to the curb with large vehicles that can be impacted when these obstructions exist. Examples include snow and ice removal, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, school bus travel, etc. Overgrown tree limbs and vegetation also impact the sight distance for the motoring, public which can be a safety concern. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for the specific requirements.

RECYCLING

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-Off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

WASTE OIL DISPOSAL

Waste oil (motor, cooking and transmission oil) can be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building (lower campus level) Monday – Friday from 7:00 am – 3:30 pm. We do not accept gasoline or engine coolant (anti-freeze).

Please be aware that the site is under constant video surveillance.

YARD / WOODY WASTE COLLECTION

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Materials such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation is acceptable provided the limbs are no larger than **6 inches in diameter** and no longer than **4 feet long** (NOTE: Township brush dimensions are no larger than 6 inches in diameter and no longer than **6 feet long**). **Grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are NOT accepted.** Yard waste must either be bundled with biodegradable twine (50-pound weight limit), placed in a brown Kraft bag or in a 32-gallon can without a lid. Yard waste placed in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected. Yard waste must be out for collection by 6:00 am on the pickup date and be visible to the hauler.

RECYCLING

BRUSH RECYCLING

The brush drop-off site is open from Fridays at 3:30 pm until Mondays at 7:00 am. Weekends only!

Brush is defined as tree limbs and shrubbery no larger than 6 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by dumping lawful items that can be safely processed by our machine. Items such as garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings etc. will cause damage to our machine.



All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for **Township use only** and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York County Regional Police Department. **The site is under constant video surveillance.**

York Township accepts brush from York Township residents only as part of our recycling efforts. Please be prepared to confirm Township residency! Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects such as removing entire trees should employ the services of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose of, please contact a tree service or the York County Solid Waste Authority at 717-845-1066.

The drop off site is located at the Township Campus beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

PENN WASTE TO RETAIN RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION CONTRACT

On February 13, 2024, the York Township Board of Commissioners awarded the residential trash collection contract to Penn Waste for the next four years. The new contract will begin on July 1, 2024.

As part of the bidding process, in order to save on costs, the township will be requiring the use of mobile carts for all residents. By utilizing the mobile carts, Penn Waste will be able to collect waste and recyclables utilizing an automated collection truck. These trucks utilize a mechanical arm to load waste or recycling in the truck. With the automated loader only one driver is required. By requiring the use of mobile carts, the bidders were able to provide the best pricing for the most efficient collection.

For the new contract, you will be required to pick one of three options, a 96-, 64- or 35-gallon mobile refuse cart. Included is your choice of **One** 96-, 64-, 35-gallon mobile recycling cart, or 32-gallon township recycling container, **One** large item per week, and **12 times per year** curbside yard waste collection. Extra bag prices are also indicated below.

PAIN T AND PAINT PRODUCTS

Paint and paint products should be dried, hardened, or mixed with an absorbent material such as shredded paper or kitty litter to minimize potential impacts. Be sure to secure lids tightly and place them in a closed garbage bag.

RECYCLING

RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Penn Waste has been contracted by the Township for residential trash and recycling services. All residences are required to have trash service. Please contact Penn Waste directly at 717-767-4456 to establish services.

Each residence is permitted (3) 32-gallon bags or cans of trash, unlimited recycling with cart, one large item per week, and 12 items per year curbside yard waste collection.

Additional service bags can be purchased at the York Township Finance Office for \$4.50. Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. Carts should be placed a minimum of 3 feet from all other objects and facing the street. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight on your collection day.

Large (Bulk) Items: Residential customers are entitled to place one large (bulk) item out per week with your regular trash and recycling. You only need to contact Penn Waste in advance if the item contains refrigerant or hazardous waste. Bulk items are those which cannot be disposed of in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people. Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their rent or condo/homeowners fee must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

Please place cart at curb with lid opening toward street. Keep cart three feet from all objects and clear from overhead hazards such as trees and power lines.

York Township has four Volunteer Fire Departments with first-due responsibility in the Township. These Departments have annual fund drives each year, and you may receive a solicitation letter asking if you would donate to the company. Please consider donating to these companies to support their success.

Our fire departments are also looking for volunteers to help keep their departments running. In addition to responding to incidents, there are a variety of things that you can do to help that don't require fire experience, such as assisting with fundraising activities, applying for grants, administrative work, and financial expertise if needed.

CYBER SECURITY FOR SENIORS

Senior citizens lose billions of dollars as victims of online crime every year, and the losses increase every year. Many cyber security guides focus on terminology that is unfamiliar to non-technical people, and we think this may deter people from reading, understanding, and following the guidelines. So, we will focus first on best practices when you are online, and also on describing exploits that malicious actors use, how to protect ourselves and counter those exploits.

“Best Practices” for Online Security

1. Use strong passwords. Upper- and lower-case letters, numbers, and symbols are the strongest, and longer is better. (I-Need-New-Tires-By-12-1 is a fantastic password. It doesn't have to be random but don't be predictable.) Check a technology magazine like PCMag, CNET, or ZDNET for their recommendations on a password manager. With a password manager, you only have to remember ONE password: the app. stores the rest of them.
2. Keep software updated. Device and “app” updates are important because they plug the holes in software that let bad guys in. Don't use any device that hasn't had any updates in a year. It's not safe. And enable the built-in security features on your device!
3. Don't use public Wi-Fi that has no password or a password is posted right there at the counter. There are literally bad people who will sit there looking angelic and listening to Wi-Fi signals for useful info. (such as your Amazon order with your credit card number). There are safe ways to use public Wi-Fi, but it requires protective software to make the data stream useless to snoopers.
4. Don't share personal details online (Facebook, Nextdoor, etc.). Just because the other person's profile shows a happy family photo with lots of information that sounds like us, doesn't mean that's who they really are. There are THOUSANDS of fake profiles like this, and they are aggregating information about folks who overshare personal information. If any group, company, or agency requests significant personal information, push back a little and ask them why they are asking for it. We personally don't provide any optional information to anyone, period.
5. Don't engage with callers you don't know. Even if you're just “playing along” to waste their time. They are experts at collecting information that you may not even realize you are giving out. They may even be recording you to create authorizations in your own voice. Just hang up.

What to Watch out for 🕵️

When someone you don't know and did not initiate contact with ...

- 📌 ... starts asking personal information, even if they offer some true tidbit about you – **BE VERY CAREFUL.** Resist the urge to trust them or provide the info. they seek. This is called Social Engineering; it's what those bad folks I talked about in Item 4 above do.
- 📌 ... tells you that some official agency (IRS, Sheriff's Office, utility company, your bank, etc.) needs you to make a payment to stop some catastrophe – don't do it without verifying on your own. Get their name and phone number. Do not call that number back – find the real phone number of the agency and call them to see if there is a problem. This is called phishing, smishing, and other similar words.
- 📌 ... if anyone sends you an email or message with a link or attachment that they tell you to click to resolve an urgent problem, or a window pops up on your device, **DON'T CLICK IT.** Close the app. Contact the sender at a phone number or email address that YOU find for them. Never contact them at a web site, email, or phone number that THEY provide.

It only takes a minute to do things carefully to prevent cyber-crimes. It takes months to recover from them.

Although many patients have medical insurance coverage of some type, most insurance plans cover only a portion of the fees associated with transportation to the hospital or will pay for only those fees they consider to be “usual and customary.” Unfortunately, this amount is usually far below our cost to provide 24-hour-a-day emergency ambulance service to a population of 40,000+ citizens. Any portion of the fees not covered by private insurance, becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a *First Capital EMS Subscriber*, payment from your insurance carrier(s) will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier.

Subscribers shall forward any payments received directly from their insurance carrier to First Capital EMS immediately upon receipt.

The demand for emergency medical services has grown dramatically over the past several years. If we are already committed to an emergency when you need us, the 911 Center will dispatch the next closest available ambulance service. This subscription is also honored by 5 neighboring EMS agencies: Jacobus Ambulance, Red Lion Ambulance, Southern York County EMS, Eureka Fire and Ambulance, Rose Fire Company (New Freedom).

**All patients will be responsible for a charge of \$95 – \$300 for refusal of transport, when evaluation and/or treatment is provided. Non-transport is not covered by the subscription.*

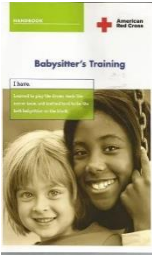

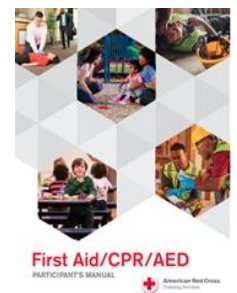

- **ADVANCE PAYMENT** is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks or cash only. Checks may be made payable to York Township. Registration is not complete until payment is received.
- **PARTICIPATION** in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- **THE DEPARTMENT** is **NOT** responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class. No refunds for bus trips will be given when spots are cancelled less than 45 days before the trip unless the trip is cancelled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- **PROGRAM SIZE** is limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- **PROGRAM DATES & TIMES** are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.

PARK RULES/HOURS

- All Township Parks, with the exception of York Township Park, are closed from dusk to dawn. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- No littering.
- No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- **NO GOLFING IN PARKS.** Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned. Grills may not be placed on picnic tables.
- No solicitation.
- **No alcoholic beverages or drugs.** No one shall use or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs in any parks.
- **Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.**
- Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- No facilities may be reserved or events scheduled without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- Parks may be closed if hazardous conditions endanger life or property. In said event, there should be no trespassing on park property in said times.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- **No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game / food trucks, etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.**
