FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK

<u>UPDATES ON VARIOUS PROJECTS AND TOWNSHIP NEWS</u> *APRIL – JULY 2024*

Below are some highlights the Board approved during this period:

- Approved a lease agreement and a conditional use to allow P3 Towers LLC to construct a 145' monopole at the municipal campus
- Awarded five Department of Fire and Rescue scholarships to firefighters or their children
- Re-appointment of James O'Neill and Kathleen Dellinger to Recreation Board for a term expiring May 1, 2029
- Accepted the resignation of William Descar from the Zoning Hearing Board and appointed Jess Snyder to fill the unexpired term ending December 2024
- Approved the purchase of two John Deere Z997R Diesel Mowers from Deere & Company for \$49,024.12

LEAF COLLECTION

The 2024 Leaf Collection will begin Monday, October 21. Residents who wish to participate should place their leaves in piles next to the curb or at the edge of the street.

Please **DO NOT** mix tree limbs, grass, shrubs, hedge trimmings, concrete block, brick, or any other foreign material in the leaf pile. Leaves will not be collected if foreign objects are mixed in with the pile.

Updates to the leaf collection routes will be posted daily on the York Township website's homepage under "Leaf Collection Daily Updates."

We cannot give an exact day of pick-up due to weather, equipment breakdown and employee availability. Our crews typically cover every Township property at least four to five times a season. Depending on the volume, it may take as long as two to three weeks between visits.

WINTER MAINTENANCE POLICIES OVERVIEW

The objective of the York Township Department of Public Works winter maintenance program is to provide safe roads to the traveling public.

WINTER MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES



We have divided all Township roads into routes. An operator with pre-determined equipment is assigned to one of these routes. The majority of the time this is the standard deployment, however, depending on the conditions, we may only deploy 6 operators to treat the snow emergency roads or what is designated as the priority routes. Snow emergency

roads are posted with signs and are designated as such due to factors of high traffic volume, steep grades, and areas with limited access or close proximity to the Schools, Police, Fire and Medical Facilities.

Prior to the storm you may notice the pretreating of certain priority roads with liquid brine. The brine is a specific concentration (23.3%) of sodium chloride that lowers the freezing point of water. Although we would like to pre-treat all of our roads, it's just not possible due to time and equipment availability. When appropriate we plan to pretreat all of the snow emergency routes with liquid brine.

SNOW EMERGENCIES

On rare occasions a snow emergency will be declared. The initial focus will be on the priority (snow emergency posted) roads. The snow emergency declaration will be broadcast on the local radio and television stations and will be posted on the York Township website. Again, all snow emergency streets are identified with signage. After the snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency for any person:

- To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency routes designated; or
- 2. To operate a motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route in such a manner or in such a reasonable condition as to allow or permit such vehicle to become stalled on such route, either by reason of the fact that the driving wheels of such vehicle are not equipped with tire chains or effective tires or by reason of the fact that the motor fuel supply of such vehicle has been allowed to become exhausted.

Failure to abide by the above is a violation of a Township ordinance and may result in fines and / or towing costs. For a complete list of streets and a full text of the ordinance, please visit the Township web site.

MAILBOXES and DRIVEWAYS

York Township WILL NOT compensate property owners should their mailbox, or any other object become damaged due to the removal of snow from Township roads. Any object placed in the road right-of-way, including a mailbox, fence, landscaping, etc. is at the owner's risk. The public right of way is on average 50 feet wide (25 feet from the center of the roadway).

It is suggested that you wait until all plowing is complete before shoveling out the end of your driveway. If you do shovel out before the plows have come through, try to clear a spot upstream of your driveway. This will allow the snow from the plow to unload before the driveway. It won't prevent all snow from going back in front of your driveway, but it will reduce the amount. The snow must be plowed from the street, therefore all driveways and properties will be affected to some degree.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

STATE ROADS

Many roads within York Township are owned and maintained by PennDOT. Refer to our website for a list of all state roads. PennDOT has their own policies and procedures for winter maintenance. Please contact the local PennDOT maintenance office at 717-848-6230 for assistance. York Township does not perform winter maintenance on any state roads.

EMERGENCIES

If you notice an emergency with sanitary sewers, roadways, or stormwater facilities, please call the Public Works Department from 7:00 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday at 717-741-3861 x170.

After these hours or on weekends/holidays, dial 911.

OBSTRUCTIONS THAT OVERHANG THE ROAD

Please be aware that as property owners in York Township, you are responsible to keep your property clear from any obstructions that overhang the edge of the road. Examples include but are not limited to tree limbs, shrubbery, hedges, grassy areas, mailboxes, fencing, etc. Many activities occur close to the curb with large vehicles that can be impacted when these obstructions exist. Examples include snow and ice removal, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, school bus travel, etc. Overgrown tree limbs and vegetation also impact the sight distance for the motoring public which can be a safety concern. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for the specific requirements.

STORMWATER

PREVENTING STORMWATER POLLUTION THIS FALL

It is that time of year again, fall is here! York Township would like to clarify the importance of preventing stormwater pollution while making the most of the fall season. *Stormwater* runoff is generated from rain and snowmelt events that flow over land or impervious surfaces, such as paved streets, parking lots, and building rooftops, and does not soak into the ground. On its journey to the stream, stormwater runoff can pick up harmful substances that pollute our waterways.

There are many sources of stormwater pollution unique to autumn, and we need your help to control them. The leaves are falling, and their improper disposal poses a threat to our water resources. Leaf litter and yard waste dumped into a stormwater basin or near a waterway can cause harmful nutrient accumulation. Likewise, leaves swept into the street can easily enter storm drains and make their way into the nearest stream.

Fall is the time for seeding and fertilizing your lawn. It's important to note that if excess fertilizer is applied, it cannot be absorbed by the soil and washes away with rain. Also, if you are working on a landscaping project in your yard, bare soil can run off into streams and cause sediment pollution. All of these problems can be avoided by putting some of our pollution prevention tips into practice:

- Dispose of leaf litter and yard waste in a compost pile and <u>never</u> in the street or stream. You can shred yard and leaf waste to use as mulch or fertilizer for your yard and garden; or you can participate in the Township's curbside yard waste collection program.
- Do not use fertilizers immediately before a rainstorm, and do not apply them in excess. Always follow the directions on the bottle for safe application and disposal whenever you use a chemical product. Reduce outdoor and household chemical use as much as possible.



A little extra caution while you keep up with your fall to-do list can make a big difference for the health of our waterways; and we thank you for cooperating with this effort!

YORK TOWNSHIP UPDATES COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

York and Spring Garden Townships have partnered to update both municipalities' Comprehensive Plans as a joint effort with the goal of analyzing both municipalities as a geographic area and recommend municipal and multi-municipal action(s), as appropriate, to coordinate regulatory, service and capital improvement decisions. The plan furthers current cooperative efforts and includes new opportunities for intergovernmental approaches to the cost-effective delivery of services. The public is encouraged to participate in the process to share thoughts about Township planning and development goals. Please watch the York Township Planning Commission agendas for upcoming meetings where the Comprehensive Plan Update will be discussed.

ZONING

ORDINANCE REVIEW - CHAPTER 107: BURNING, OUTDOOR

Definitions.

LEAF WASTE — Leaves, garden residue, shrubbery and tree trimmings and similar materials, but not including grass clippings. OPEN BURNING — Any fire not confined or contained in a receptacle of acceptable construction (e.g., metal, masonry to other nonflammable material), 55 gallons or smaller, and equipped with a top so constructed as to prevent fly ash from escaping into the atmosphere.

PERSON — Any natural person, partnership, association, firm, company, or corporation or other entity.

RECYCLABLE — Any material that is required to be recycled in York Township under Pa. Act 101, including woody yard waste and leaves.

Prohibited acts. No person under the age of 18 shall be permitted to regulate, manage or control an open burning, shall conduct an open burning between sunset and sunrise; shall conduct an open burning within 50 feet of any building; shall conduct an open burning within 25 feet of any adjoining property line; shall conduct an open burning on any public or private street, street right-of-way, alley, road or highway; shall conduct an open burning of recyclable or leaf waste; shall conduct an open burning consisting of construction residue and waste.

Exemptions. The performance of an official duty of any public officer, if the open burning is necessary for the prevention of a fire hazard which cannot be abated by any other means; an open burning required for the protection of public health at the direction of the appropriate public officer; instructing personnel in firefighting when approved by a Fire Chief in their first response area in York Township; ceremonies and activities done under adult supervision, such as bonfires done in conjunction with school-related or civic functions, scouting and related activities, group wiener roasts or campfires; agricultural management and conservation practices and protection, provided burning is located 100 feet or more from any building or structure. Materials must originate from the property on which the open burning is being conducted.

Control and extinguishment. All fires, whether or not an open burning, shall be kept under competent and continuous supervision. All flammable and combustible materials not in use as a fuel for a fire shall be removed a sufficient distance from a fire as to not constitute a hazard. Proper notification shall be made to the York County Emergency Center (911) of the time, place and period of an open burning. All fires, ashes and coals shall be thoroughly extinguished after the use thereof has been completed. Notification to the York County Emergency Center (911) shall be made when the open burning is completed.

Enforcement; violations and penalties. The York Township Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the York County Regional Police Department to enforce the provisions of this chapter in the same manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon summary conviction, be subject to a penalty of not less than \$50 nor more than \$600 per violation. Should such person refuse or neglect to pay such penalty, such person shall be subject to imprisonment to the extent allowed by law for the punishment of summary offenses. A separate offense shall arise for each day or portion thereof in which a violation is found to exist or for each section of this chapter which is found to have been violated.

RECYCLING

BRUSH RECYCLING

The brush drop-off site is open from Fridays at 3:30 pm until Mondays at 7:00 am. Weekends only!

Brush is defined as tree limbs and shrubbery no larger than 6 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by dumping lawful items that can be safely processed by our machine. Items such as garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings etc. will cause damage to our machine.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are for **Township use only** and are not meant for the general public to use or take. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York County Regional Police Department. **The site is under constant video surveillance.**

York Township accepts brush from York Township residents only as part of our recycling efforts. Please be prepared to confirm Township residency! Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects such as removing entire trees should employ the services of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose of, please contact a tree service or the York County Solid Waste Authority at 717-845-1066.

The drop off site is located at the Township Campus beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

RECYCLING

PENN WASTE RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION

The new residential trash and recycling contract with Penn Waste began July 1, 2024. All residences are required to have trash service. Please contact Penn Waste directly at 717-767-4456 to establish services.

As part of the bidding process, in order to save on costs, the township will be requiring the use of mobile carts for all residents. By utilizing the mobile carts, Penn Waste will be able to collect waste and recyclables utilizing an automated collection truck. These trucks utilize a mechanical arm to load waste or recycling in the truck. With the automated loader only one driver is required. By placing material in the mobile carts, the bidders were able to provide the best pricing for the most efficient collection.

In the current contract, you are required to have **one** of three options, a 96, 64 or 35 gallon mobile refuse cart. Included is your choice of **one** 96, 64 or 35 gallon mobile recycling cart, or 32 gallon township recycling container, **one** large (bulk) item per week, and **12 times per year** curbside yard waste collection. Extra bag prices are also indicated below.

A large (bulk) item is any item that weighs 50 pounds or more, which cannot be disposed of in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people. You should contact Penn Waste in advance if you are placing a large item curbside or if the item contains refrigerant or hazardous waste. Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their condo/homeowners fees or rent, must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.


Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. Carts should be placed a minimum of 3 feet from all other objects and facing the street. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight on your collection day.

PAINT AND PAINT PRODUCTS

Paint and paint products should be dried, hardened, or mixed with an absorbent material such as shredded paper or kitty litter to minimize potential impacts. Be sure to secure lids tightly and place them in a closed garbage bag.

Please place cart at curb with lid opening toward street.

Keep cart three feet from all objects and clear from
overhead hazards such as trees and power lines.



COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following:

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

The York County Solid Waste Authority's Residential Electronics Recycling Program is free and open to York County residents ONLY and is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon at the Small Load Drop-Off Facility at the York County Resource Recovery Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road, York, PA 17406.

YARD / WOODY WASTE COLLECTION

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Materials such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation is acceptable provided the limbs are no larger than 6 inches in diameter and no longer than 4 feet long (NOTE: Township brush dimensions are no larger than 6 inches in diameter and no longer than 6 feet long). Grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are NOT accepted. Yard waste must either be bundled with biodegradable twine (50-pound weight limit), placed in a brown Kraft bag or in a 32-gallon can without a lid. Yard waste placed in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected. Yard waste must be out for collection by 6:00 am on the pickup date and be visible to the hauler.

The Goodwill Fire Company #1 of York Township operates as York County Station 19 out of our station located at 2318 South Queen St.

In 2023 our members responded to 1000 calls for service. We provide Engine Company (hose and water), Truck Company (aerial ladder, ground ladders and specialized tools), Rescue Company (Vehicle extrication, technical rescue), and Fire Police (traffic control) services. Along with our Fire and Rescue Duties, we will assist our local ambulance services when needed.

Your Fire Company volunteers, along with our part time paid drivers, spend hundreds of hours a month training, preparing and maintaining equipment, and completing administrative duties.

We find our service to be highly rewarding and strong bonds are formed amongst our members. It is not uncommon for our members to describe their fellow volunteers as a second family.

The holiday season is soon upon us which means lots of fun festivities are in store! Many of us who have furry family members want to include them in the fun too, but there are a few important safety tips to keep in mind around the holiday season.

During the holidays, the environment in our homes often changes. The house looks different with decorations, more packages may be delivered, enticing smells fill the air, and more visitors come. While we look forward to the festivities, the new sounds, smells, and changes can cause stress for some dogs. Consider keeping your dog in a room away from the bulk of the activity until people are settled. Even then, spending time around people, especially little children, should be limited or done supervised, on-leash. Extra excitement outside of your dog's routine may elevate their stress, especially those prone to be more anxious.

The door may be opened more with deliveries and people coming and going. Make sure your dog is secure before opening the door. They should be on a leash, behind a closed gate or door, or in a crate. Make sure everyone in the family follows your safety plan. To be safe, your dog should be microchipped and wear a collar with up-to-date ID tags if they slip out the door or

Keep extension cords and tree lights out of reach of dogs, especially puppies in the chewing stage. Putting an exercise pen around the tree will help to keep your dog safe and your tree intact. Avoid decorations such as tinsel, ornament hooks, and popcorn strings, which can harm dogs. If you choose to decorate with these items, ensure they are high enough to be out of your pet's reach. When opening gifts, it is best to quickly remove paper, ribbon, and bows from areas where your dog tends to wander around so that none of these items are ingested.

Be especially careful with food. At a time when people may leave plates of food lying around from room to room, your dogs must not have access to the food or the trash can until clean-up has been done. Unless someone always has eyes on your dog, it is too easy for him to help himself to food that may not be safe, including the following:

- Cooked turkey bones
- · Fatty meat scraps
- Foods containing chocolate, cocoa, raisins, grapes, currants, and some nuts
- Sugar-free gums and candies that contain xylitol

If your dog accidentally ingests one of the food or drink items above, please immediately contact your veterinarian or an animal emergency hospital.

YORK COUNTY SPECIAL NEEDS REGISTRY

The York County Special Needs Registry is a free, confidential, and voluntary program offered by the York County Office of Emergency Management to help local municipalities to identify residents who may need additional assistance during an emergency or disaster. This includes, but is not limited to, individuals:

- · with mobility difficulties
- with intellectual or developmental disabilities
- with sight or hearing impairments
- with special medical equipment
- without a reliable or consistent form of transportation
- · without access to emergency information via TV, radio, internet

transportation healthcare
drive illness accessible assistive accessible design acces

Any information that you provide is compiled and shared with York Township Emergency Management Agency to assist in emergency planning and response efforts. The Registry can be used for more than just evacuation purposes – it is also helpful in any emergency situation (fire, chemical spill, police incident, etc.). All information is *secure and confidential*. We will only contact you: 1) to verify that you are still a township resident and still have Special Needs; 2) if there is an incident that may impact you to determine if you require assistance.

If you have a computer, you can sign up for the registry by way of an online form located at the following web site: https://www.yorkcountypa.gov/952/York-County-Special-Needs-Registry

You can use the online form to register yourself, a family member, or client. A PDF document (located at https://yorkcountypa.gov/DocumentCenter/View/1585) is also available if you would rather print out and mail it in.

If you do not have a computer to download or complete the form online, you can obtain copies of the form at the York Township Municipal Offices or call York Township Emergency Management Coordinator at the contact information on the rear of this newsletter.

COMMUNITY: York County Regional Police Department is committed to serving our citizens and communities. We look for opportunities to grow and consolidate resources to better serve our communities. We are currently in talks with Spring Garden Township for a possible merger between York County Regional Police Department and Spring Garden Police Department.

AWARDS/COMMENDATIONS: At the May York County Regional Police Commissioner Meeting, Corporal Stephanie Phillips was awarded Officer of the Year for 2023. Phillips is an 8-year veteran of the department. Phillips was chosen as Officer of the Year because of her positive attitude, willingness to take on challenges, volunteer for assignments, and her desire to help people and better herself and the department. Also at the May York County Regional Police Commission meeting, 5 officers were recognized by Chief Damon for their performance on-duty and going above and beyond: Sgt Corey Shaffer, Officer Adam Cohick and Officer Ryan Henry, all received the Medal of Distinction; Officer Kevin Romine received a Chief's Commendation; and Officer Michelle Hoover received two Chief's Commendations. At the June 13 York County Regional Police Commission Meeting, three citizens received Citizen Commendations. Holly Pennewill of York, Blake Casteel of York, and Nicholas Suewski of York were recognized for their quick action and bravery on March 9, 2024 during a motor vehicle collision in the area of Camp Betty Washington Road between Sage Hill Road and Belle Road in York Township. The crash involved a single vehicle, which was occupied by three people and overturned into Mill Creek. These brave citizens removed all three vehicle occupants to safety. At the July York County Regional Police Commission meeting, Officer Darius Mitchell was recognized by Chief Damon, with a Chief's Commendation for his actions on May 15, 2024. Officer Mitchell responded to a call where a large dog was attacking a woman. Officer Mitchell acted quickly and used his service weapon to put down the dog, saving the woman's life.



- **REGISTRATION FORMS for various programs** will be placed online at www.yorktownshiprec.com as they become available. Paper forms for some programs may be necessary and will be available at the YTRec Office.
- ADVANCE PAYMENT is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks or cash only. Checks may be made payable to York Township. Registration is not complete until payment is received.
- PARTICIPATION in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- THE DEPARTMENT is NOT responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class. No refunds for bus trips will be given when spots are canceled less than 45 days before the trip unless the trip is canceled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- PROGRAM SIZE is limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- PROGRAM DATES & TIMES are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN**—Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.
- CANCELLATIONS—In case of inclement weather, we may cancel our programs. Participants will be notified of a canceled program. For field closures, contact the YTRec Hotline number at 717-741-3861 x350. The hotline is typically updated Monday Friday by 4:00 pm and Saturday Sunday by 7:00 am.
- MIN/MAX—There is a minimum number of participants needed before a class can "go." If a sufficient number does not register, the class will be cancelled. Ensure your choice—register now!

PARK RULES/HOURS

- All Township Parks, with the exception of York Township Park, are closed from dusk to dawn. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- No littering.
- No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- NO GOLFING IN PARKS. Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned. Grills may not be placed on picnic tables.
- No solicitation.
- No alcoholic beverages or drugs. No one shall use or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs in any parks.
- Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.
- Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- No facilities may be reserved or events scheduled without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- Parks may be closed if hazardous conditions endanger life or property. In said event, there should be no trespassing on park property in said times.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game / food trucks, etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.
