SIGN UP TODAY WITH XPRESS BILL PAY!

York Township has partnered with Xpress Bill Pay (XBP) for electronic payments of sewer bills. XBP is **Fee-Free** and their acceptable payment types include Debit Card, Credit Card and Electronic Fund Transfer. Embrace paperless billing, Auto Pay (with payment notification), and view your payment history through your XBP account. PROTECTING YOUR HOME AGAINST FLOODING

Flooding is Pennsylvania's top hazard and can occur anywhere that it rains, especially during spring snowmelt or hurricane season (summer – fall). Low-lying areas, near waterways, and locations near levees or dams are more at risk. However, flash flooding can happen in locations that are not designated floodplains during heavy rain, so everyone should take some basic preventive measures to safeguard their costliest investment.

To prepare, know your flood risk, stay informed with emergency alerts (see our last township newsletter article for more info. on alerts) and create a personal evacuation plan in case of a flood warning or evacuation recommendation.

1. Invest in Flood Insurance

Did you know 1" of water can cause \$25,000 in damage? Basic homeowners' insurance may not cover all flood damage. Do a periodic "insurance check-up" with your agent to make sure you have the right coverage / amounts of coverage, especially when you change policy carriers. Consider also that a burst internal water pipe can cause flooding damage, so make sure your policy covers water entering from *outside the home*, as well as flooding from *internal plumbing failures*. Renters and business owners also need to check their insurance coverage to ensure that it covers flooding damage and related costs.

2. Take a Household Inventory / Protect Important Documents

Take photos and videos of all major household items and valuables. Retain these documents in a safe place because they are important when filing insurance claims. Save copies of birth certificates, passports, medical records, titles, and insurance papers in a safe, dry place. Keep original documents in a watertight storage box. Consider keeping a copy in a SECURE, password-protected cloud storage location or safety deposit box.

3. Check Around Your Home

- Check your foundation (exterior and interior if accessible) for any cracks. If you have them, use sealant, mortar or masonry caulk to fill them to help keep water out.
- Observe all gutters (attached to home and buried outflow lines) during heavy rain and look for any overflows or ponding. Clear debris from gutters and downspouts to avoid accumulation of water near the foundation.
- Check the roadway in front of your home regularly and remove debris from any storm drain grates.

4. Install a Sump Pump / Backflow Valve

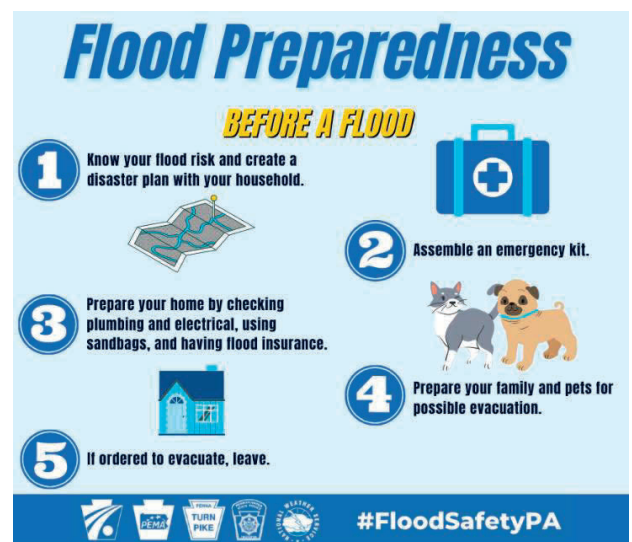
Make sure you have a sump pump (ideally with battery backup in case your electricity goes out). Test pump operation periodically by pouring some water into the sump well. You can also consider hiring a plumber to install a backflow valve to push the flow of water and sewer backup away from your home.

5. Move Items Up

Raise and anchor air conditioning condensers, heat pumps, water meters, and other service equipment onto platforms at least 1 foot above the potential flood elevation. Consider raising other major appliances above the ground floor. Do not store valuables (especially documents) on the basement floor: use shelving to keep valuable items well above the floor level.

6. Landscape to Improve Drainage

Build up any sunken areas around the foundation by adding dirt to create a grade that directs water away from the home. Dig small depressions to properly channel water, and otherwise improve your yard so it slopes away from your home.

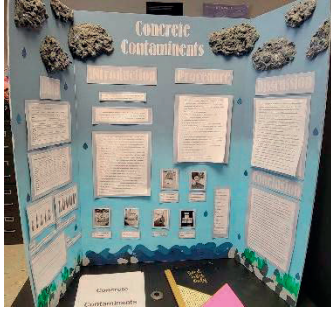

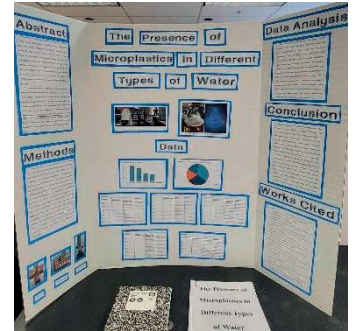
2025 DALLASTOWN AREA HIGHSCHOOL SCIENCE & ENGINEERING FAIR WINNERS

York Township congratulates the 2025 York Township Science & Engineering Fair scholarship winners. York Township provides scholarships for the best junior and senior “Water Quality or Stormwater Management Project” as part of our stormwater management program.



The senior project winner selected was “Concrete Contaminants,” by **Kyla Lawson and Corina Ambartsumyan**, 12th grade. The purpose of Kyla and Corina’s project was to study the “concrete leachability of calcium hydroxide which creates an alkaline environment when introduced to water, damaging organisms and disrupting ecosystems.”

The junior project winner selected was “The Presence of Microplastics in Different Types of Water,” by **Aarav Shah**, 9th grade. The purpose of Aarav’s project was to “test different types of water to check the amount of microplastics within every kind of water and assess which is best for health.”

ORDINANCE REVIEW - §265-651 NONCOMMERCIAL KEEPING OF LIVESTOCK

Residents are encouraged to call the Township BEFORE bringing home any type of livestock to determine if their property meets the requirements of the Ordinance. Livestock is defined as “Any domestic animal commonly associated with farming, including but not limited to the bovine, equine, poultry, swine and/or sheep families, raised and kept primarily for food, fiber or for recreation” and the ordinance regulations are as follows:

Noncommercial Keeping of Livestock is permitted in the RA District as an accessory use, and is permitted by special exception in the RL and RM Districts as an accessory use, subject to the following:

- A. The minimum required lot area shall be two (2) acres. In addition, the following specifies lot area requirements by the size of livestock kept. The keeping of a combination of livestock (Group 1, 2, 3 or 4) shall require a density equal to the ratio of the number of livestock by type, in no case shall a lot contain more than fifty (50) total livestock.
 1. Group 1: Livestock with an average adult weight of less than ten (10) pounds shall be permitted at a density of twelve (12) per acre, up to a maximum of forty-eight (48).
 2. Group 2: Livestock with an average adult weight between ten (10) and 100 pounds shall be permitted at a density of five (5) per acre.
 3. Group 3: Livestock with an average adult weight between 100 and 200 pounds shall be permitted at a density of two (2) per acre.
 4. Group 4: Livestock with an average adult weight greater than 200 pounds shall be permitted at a density of one (1) per acre.
- B. No structure used to house noncommercial livestock shall be located within the front yard. The following lists minimum setbacks (from side and rear lot lines) imposed upon the placement of any structure used to house noncommercial livestock. Should one structure be used to house more than one type of livestock, the most restrictive setback shall apply.
 1. Group 1: twenty-five (25) feet
 2. Group 2: fifty (50) feet
 3. Groups 3 and 4: 100 feet
- C. All outdoor pasture/recreation areas shall be enclosed with fencing sufficient to prevent the escape of livestock; such fencing shall be set back at least ten (10) feet from all property lines.
- D. All livestock and their housing and their outdoor pasture/recreation areas shall be properly maintained so as not to become a nuisance to adjoining properties. All livestock wastes shall be managed in accordance with the most current PA-DEP published guidelines for manure management.
- E. All Noncommercial Keeping of Livestock operations shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws.

YARD / WOODY WASTE COLLECTION

Township residents are encouraged to recycle their yard/woody waste by either curbside collection or at the Township drop-off facility. Materials such as tree and shrubbery trimmings and other organic landscape vegetation is acceptable provided the limbs are no larger than **6 inches in diameter** and no longer than **4 feet long** (NOTE: Township brush dimensions are no larger than 6 inches in diameter and no longer than **6 feet long**). **Grass, weeds, dirt, stones, fruit & vegetable scraps, trash or recyclables are NOT accepted.** Yard waste must either be bundled with biodegradable twine (50-pound weight limit), placed in a brown Kraft bag or in a 32-gallon can without a lid. Yard waste placed in plastic bags or mobile carts will not be collected. Yard waste must be out for collection by 6:00 am on the pickup date and be visible to the hauler.

2025 CURBSIDE DATES:

PAINT AND PAINT PRODUCTS

Paint and paint products should be dried, hardened, or mixed with an absorbent material such as shredded paper or kitty litter to minimize potential impacts. Be sure to secure lids tightly and place them in a closed garbage bag.

BRUSH RECYCLING

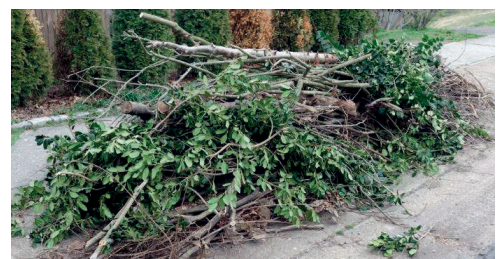
The brush drop-off site is open from Fridays at 3:30 pm until Mondays at 7:00 am. Weekends only!

Brush is defined as tree limbs, shrubbery, leaves and the like (no grass) no larger than 6 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length. York Township accepts brush from York Township residents only as part of our recycling efforts. Brush recycling is intended to clean up small amounts of debris from residential properties. The program is not intended to accept large tree removal projects. Large projects such as removing entire trees should employ the services of a commercial contractor. If you have large amounts of material to dispose of, please contact York Township first for approval.

The drop-off site is located at the Township Campus beyond the gate between the two signs. Please enter from Oak Road. Do not enter from Coventry Road for this is a restricted area for Township employees only.

We ask that you participate in this program responsibly by not dumping unlawful items at the site. Examples are garbage, metals, concrete, lumber, stumps, stones, grass clippings etc. Public Works will process the brush into mulch which will be made available to Township residents. At the present time, mulch is free and on a first-come first-served basis.

All other material and items you see beyond the gate are Township property and are not meant for public use. If you see a violation, please report it to the Township or York County Regional Police Department. They can be reached at (717) 741-1259. The site is under constant video surveillance.



RECYCLING

PENN WASTE RESIDENTIAL TRASH COLLECTION

The new residential trash and recycling contract with Penn Waste began July 1, 2024. All residences are required to have trash service. Please contact Penn Waste directly at 717-767-4456 to establish services.

As part of the bidding process, in order to save on costs, the township will be requiring the use of mobile carts for all residents. By utilizing the mobile carts, Penn Waste will be able to collect waste and recyclables utilizing an automated collection truck. These trucks utilize a mechanical arm to load waste or recycling in the truck. With the automated loader only one driver is required. By placing material in the mobile carts, the bidders were able to provide the best pricing for the most efficient collection.

In the current contract, you are required to have **one** of three options, a 96-, 64- or 35-gallon mobile refuse cart. Included is your choice of **one** 96-, 64- or 35-gallon mobile recycling cart, or 32-gallon township recycling container, **one** large (bulk) item per week, and **12 times per year** curbside yard waste collection. Extra bag prices are also indicated below.

A **large (bulk) item** is any item that weighs 50 pounds or more, which cannot be disposed of in the regular trash container and can be lifted by two people. **You should contact Penn Waste in advance if you are placing a large item curbside or if the item contains refrigerant or hazardous waste.** Residents who pay for waste collection as part of their condo/homeowners fees or rent, must contact their landlord or association for the rules regarding bulk items per their commercial contract.

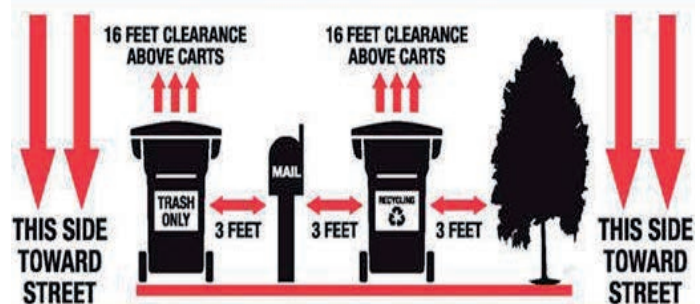
Residential trash and recycling collection begins at 6:00 am on your collection day. Carts should be placed a minimum of 3 feet from all other objects and facing the street. All refuse and recycling containers and any larger (bulk) items shall be placed curbside no earlier than 5:00 pm on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection and shall be removed no later than 12:00 midnight on your collection day.

WASTE OIL DISPOSAL

Waste oil (motor, cooking and transmission oil) can be dropped off at the Public Works Service Building (lower campus level) Monday – Friday from 7:00 am – 3:30 pm.

We do not accept gasoline or engine coolant (anti-freeze). **Please be aware that the site is under constant video surveillance.**

Please place cart at curb with lid opening toward street.
Keep cart three feet from all objects and clear from overhead hazards such as trees and power lines.



COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IS REQUIRED BY LAW

Pennsylvania State Act 101 of 1988 and York Township Ordinance 2006-12 require nonresidential establishments to recycle. To comply with the State and Local laws, you are required to recycle the following:

- High-Grade Office Paper • Steel and Bimetallic Can
- Leaf Waste • Corrugated Paper (cardboard)
- Aluminum • Glass (clear, brown and green)

COMMUNITY: York County Regional Police Department is committed to serving our citizens and communities. We look for opportunities to grow and consolidate resources to better serve our communities.

MERGER: On February 13, 2025, the YCRPD Commission voted to merge with Spring Garden Township Police Department, bringing Spring Garden Township on as 4th Charter member of the commission. MOU's have been signed so that officers from both departments may handle calls for service in either jurisdiction until the merger is complete on June 1, 2025. This merger will raise our officer complement to over 80 sworn officers.

CONGRATULATIONS: At the January York County Regional Police commission meeting, Officer Mathew Eckert was recognized by Police Chief Timothy Damon & Fire Chief Joseph Stevens, with Chief's Commendation for his actions on November 30, 2024. Officer Eckert responded to a structure fire call, with entrapment, in the 400 block of Holly Dr. in East Manchester Township. Upon arrival, Officer Eckert noticed a female within the residence who was leaning out of a window. Eckert attempted to extract the woman through the window but moved to a backdoor that was nearby. Officer Eckert was able to pry the back door open to allow the woman to crawl through and get out of the home. At the February York County Regional Police commission meeting, Corporal Christopher Glass was recognized by Police Chief Timothy Damon with a Chief's Commendation for his actions on December 28, 2024. Corporal Glass responded to a bank robbery at the Orrstown Bank on Cape Horn Rd. in Windsor Township. While responding, Corporal Glass received updated information on the location of the suspect vehicle but not a description of the vehicle. Corporal Glass observed a vehicle in the area with an occupant who was acting suspiciously. He observed the vehicle passing another vehicle on Winterstown Rd. Corporal Glass attempted to stop the vehicle while the occupant tossed cash out of the window of the vehicle. Glass was able to get the vehicle stopped and arrested the suspect and recovered the money taken in the bank robbery.

EVENTS: In November 2024, we held a "Cram the Cruiser" food drive at GIANT Foods on 3175 Cape Horn Rd. The food items collected were donated to the York County Food Bank.

K9 UNIT: Throughout Tango's 3.5-year career, between training and deployments he has searched for electronic devices over 2,500 times and has located over 10,000 devices. Tango had a productive 2024 and was deployed on multiple searches throughout York, Lancaster, Adams, Dauphin, and Cumberland County. Tango conducted searches for cases related to child exploitation, homicides, lost property, and prison/correctional facility searches. Dozens of electronic devices were located on these searches. He attended multiple PR events/demonstrations where we continue to raise awareness for the fight against child exploitation. Tango has been healthy & has had no medical issues since his medical scare earlier in 2024.

CRIME: December 24, 2024, HOMICIDE Sheetz 4300 N. George St. East Manchester Township, Under investigation. December 28, 2024, ARMED ROBBERY Orrstown Bank 2587 Cape Horn Rd. Windsor Township male with a bandana around his face demanded everything in a teller's register. He had a hand in his pocket like he was holding a gun. The man and his girlfriend, who drove him from the bank, were taken into custody at a home in the 300 block of Country Ridge Dr. Red Lion. Anthony James Warner and Lakiesha Nicole Stirling were both charged with Robbery and Conspiracy to Commit. January 4, 2025, Armed Robbery first block Walnut Ridge Dr. Dallastown Borough – 3 masked black males assaulted and robbed the victim, stealing a vehicle and other items. One of the males had brandished a firearm. Vehicle was later recovered, suspects identified, and charges were filed.

OBSTRUCTIONS THAT OVERHANG THE ROAD

Please be aware that as property owners in York Township, you are responsible to keep your property clear from any obstructions that overhang the edge of the road. Examples include but are not limited to tree limbs, shrubbery, hedges, grassy areas, mailboxes, fencing, etc.

Many activities occur close to the curb with large vehicles that can be impacted when these obstructions exist. Examples include snow and ice removal, street sweeping, street paving, trash collection, school bus travel, etc.

Overgrown tree limbs and vegetation also impact the sight distance for the motoring public which can be a safety concern. Refer to Ordinance # 2014-5 found on the website for the specific requirements.

Although many patients have medical insurance coverage of some type, most insurance plans cover only a portion of the fees associated with transportation to the hospital or will pay for only those fees they consider to be “usual and customary.” Unfortunately, this amount is usually far below our cost to provide 24-hour a day emergency ambulance service to a population of 40,000+ citizens. Any portion of the fees not covered by private insurance becomes an out-of-pocket expense for the patient.

As a *First Capital EMS Subscriber*, payment from your insurance carrier(s) will satisfy your obligation to us for our service costs*. Non-Subscribers are responsible for payment in full for services, regardless of the amount covered by their insurance carrier.

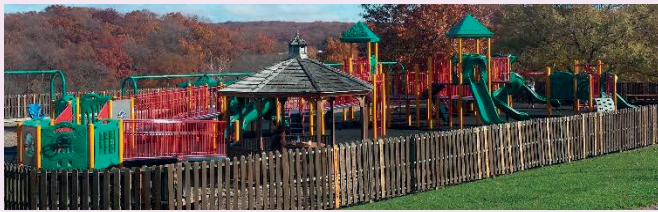

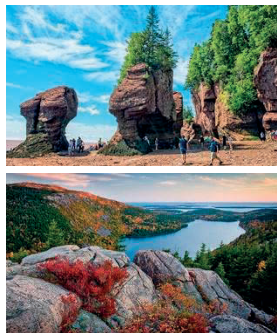

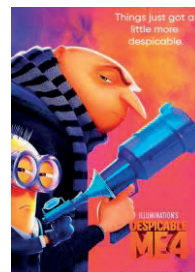

PARTICIPATION AND REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

- **REGISTRATION FORMS** for various programs will be placed online at www.yorktownshiprec.com as they become available. Paper forms for some programs may be necessary and will be available at the YTRec Office.
- **ADVANCE PAYMENT** is required for all programs as it will ensure a space in the class/program. Checks or cash only. Checks may be made payable to York Township. Registration is not complete until payment is received.
- **PARTICIPATION** in any class/program/event constitutes permission to use likeness in promotional materials.
- **THE DEPARTMENT** is **NOT** responsible for injuries while participating in any of its activities.
- **REFUNDS** will not be granted after the start of a class. No refunds for bus trips will be given when spots are canceled less than 45 days before the trip unless the trip is canceled by the Township or unless you find a replacement for your seat.
- **PROGRAM SIZE** is limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes/events reaching capacity will start a wait list.
- **PROGRAM DATES & TIMES** are contingent on availability of facilities and are subject to change.
- **PROGRAMS** postponed or not held by the instructor due to emergencies will be made up by the instructor or fees will be prorated. Classes missed by the participant will not be made up.
- **POLICY ON CHILDREN** - Participants are not permitted to bring children with them to class. Enrollment age is included with the description of most of the classes.
- **CANCELATIONS** - In case of inclement weather, we may cancel our programs. Participants will be notified of a canceled program. For field closures, contact the YTRec Hotline number at 717-741-3861 x350. The hotline is typically updated Monday – Friday by 4:00 pm and Saturday – Sunday by 7:00 am.
- **MIN/MAX** - There is a minimum number of participants needed before a class can “go.” If a sufficient number does not register, the class will be canceled. Ensure your choice—register now!

PARK RULES/HOURS

- All Township Parks, with the exception of York Township Park, are closed from dusk to dawn. York Township Park is closed between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. No trespassing during these hours or when area is otherwise closed by the Township.
- No littering.
- No negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property.
- **NO GOLFING IN PARKS.** Outdoor recreation activity is restricted to locations appropriate to the activity or as directed.
- Open fires or hot coals must be in fireplaces or grills. Fires may not be left unattended and must be thoroughly extinguished before they are abandoned. Grills may not be placed on picnic tables.
- No solicitation.
- **No alcoholic beverages or drugs.** No one shall use or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or drugs in any parks.
- **Use of explosives, fireworks, guns, rifles, air guns, bows, slingshots, or similar items is prohibited.**
- Injuring or killing wild animals is prohibited.
- Boisterous, immoral or indecent conduct is prohibited.
- No facilities may be reserved or events scheduled without completion of an application form and approval of the Recreation Director of the Township.
- Parks may be closed if hazardous conditions endanger life or property. In said event, there should be no trespassing on park property in said times.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash or otherwise tied. All canine solid waste must be removed from the park.
- Motor vehicles may be driven and parked only in designated areas.
- **No inflatables, pony rides, petting zoos, game / food trucks, etc. allowed with pavilion/building rentals.**
